JAGUAR CAMP FOR SENIORS



President's Notes: May 2006

I want to especially thank Susan Curtis for making copies of JANE's By-laws and handing them out to Board Members and Officers in attendance. I had intended to go over some of the key points during the meeting, but we decided to postpone discussion until a future meeting due to the lateness of the hour. I believe it is important for us to understand how the club is <u>supposed</u> to run, even if we sometimes stray from the by-laws from time to time!

Other highlights of the April meeting were the reports from our delegates to JCNA's Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Seattle, Adrian and Susan Curtis, David and Liz Herrick. The AGM is always an interesting event. The meeting always impresses me with the dedication of many people associated with JCNA. The tours, the awards banquet and socializing with other Jaguar owners are a real treat. The only plaque bestowed on a JANE member was in the Newsletter Category -- a 3rd place in photography by Dennis Eklof for his cover photo of the D-Type at the Ralph Lauren car exhibition at the Museum of Fine Art, Boston. (Congratulations, Dennis!) Adrian Curtis mentioned that he learned a lot about the national organization and believes it would be good for any Board Member or Officer of JANE to attend the AGM in the future. I agree.

My personal highlights in April involved driving my 1951 XK120 FHC to a JANE event for the first time! Our trip to Parker's Barn on the 2nd provided the opportunity and the car was well received – and ran well besides. A longer trip (200 miles round trip) the week after to and from Chicopee for the judge's training session provided the second outing. Again, a

I was a little disappointed with the meager showing of JANE judges at the training session hosted by Eric Hagopian at Hoppe Tool on April 9th. But maybe I should not be too surprised – it was Palm Sunday and families had many other plans. The session was notable in that we were informed about a number of changes to the judging procedures – new forms, new scoring methods, new restrictions. Since judging of cars is the reason we hold our Concours (although the social aspects of the event should not be overlooked!), it is important that we have qualified judges. Our new Chief Judge, Aldo Cipriano, is well aware of the need for quality and is taking steps to ensure our Concours is a success in August.

Rain or shine – if the weather doesn't cooperate, we move indoors. The program starts at 6 pm, but some people park their Jaguars on the lawn as early as 5 pm to start the kibitzing.

Spring is here --- time to get our Jaguars on the road!

Tour of Nova Scotia! (See JANE website for latest information)

Plans for the tour are finalized for JANE's Tour of Nova Scotia! JANE members Bruce and Anna Cake and their friends at BATANS and the Dartmouth Yacht Club will be hosting JANE for a rousing event in Halifax connected with Canada Day on July 1st.

We have 16 cars and 34 people planning to go on the Tour as of mid-April. We need a firm count by mid-May. Our hosts need to know how many people will be attending each event - e.g., how many will be on the winery tour and how many Tattoo tickets to buy. Read further for contact information.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES:

- ?? Thursday afternoon, 29 June, arrive at the Ramada Inn in Dartmouth. BATANS will host a reception at the Ramada Inn on our arrival. Keep in mind it is a 4 hour drive (195 miles) from the ferry landing at Yarmouth to Halifax.
- ?? Friday morning, 30 June, depart from Ramada Inn for a tour of Annapolis Valley with lunch and tour of the Grand Pre winery. Friday afternoon return to the Dartmouth Yacht Club for a dinner of Hip of Beef or Pig Roast
- ?? Saturday, 1 July (Canada Day) proceed to Halifax for a car show at Bishop's Landing 1 to 4 p.m. This location is on the Halifax waterfront and is in easy walking distance of all the activities scheduled for the waterfront in conjunction with Canada Day. Bishops Landing is a condo/apartment complex with a large court yard ideal for showing the cars. It is located about half way between the Casino and Pier 21. After the car show we would proceed back to the Yacht Club for boat rides down the harbour to view the fireworks celebrating Canada Day.
- ?? Sunday, 2 July Halifax International Tattoo (pipe and drum bands) matinee performance, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- ?? Monday, 3 July depart for home or further explorations of Nova Scotia, including Cape Breton. You are on your own after this.

TRAVEL PLANS

There will **not** be a single organized driving tour from here to Halifax. You are on your own for making travel plans, but many people are planning to go in groups. We will provide information on the JANE website about who is going where and when for grouping purposes. JANE members will have four options for arriving at our destination in Halifax:

?? Ferry from Portland to Yarmouth–The high-speed ferry "The Cat" will operate service from Portland on Friday, Saturday and Sunday this summer! Boat leaves at 2:30 p.m. for a four hour trip. Although Portland is relatively close to most of the JANE members who are planning to attend, the schedule does not allow us to participate in the key events. Cost is around \$700 round trip for a couple and a car.

- ?? Ferry from Bar Harbor to Yarmouth –"The Cat" will operate Monday through Thursday from Bar Harbor. Departures at 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Thursday. The 8 a.m. ferry on Thursday is the preferred option for most of us. It gets us there in time for the Thursday reception. Cost is around \$500 round trip for a couple and a car.
- ?? Ferry from St. John, NB, to Digby, NS. This is a longer drive and the ferry is less expensive.
- ?? Drive all the way long drive, but what's a car club for? Least expensive, but expect to take a couple of long days.

You will have to make your own reservations on the ferry. Although the ferry is costly, there are discounts for a round trip and for Early Bird reservations paid for before May 24th. You can reserve on-line on the website: <u>www.catferry.com</u>. You can also make your reservations by telephone at the following number: **1-888-249-7245**.

HOTEL ROOMS

As for accommodation, you can stay where you wish, but Bruce Cake, our JANE member in Halifax, has reserved a block of rooms a the Ramada Inn in Dart-mouth, NS, for a special reduced rate. Again, you must call in your own hotel reservations: Telephone **902-468-8888**, and ask for the "JANE" special room rate reserved for us by the Bruce Cake and the Dartmouth Yacht Club.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: You MUST bring a valid passport or an official birth certificate with picture identification in order to return to the US. (The old days of crossing the border with your driver's license are over.) You SHOULD contact your insurer to obtain verification that your automobile insurance is valid in Canada.

Jaguar is the marque of the year this year there is a special deal going on for all jaguar powered cars. If you run at both events you will get a discount and do it all from one form. For those of you who do not know it the Historic races at BeaveRun are normally open to all production and race cars built prior to 1973. Since Jaguar is the marque of the year ANY YEAR OR MODEL OF A JAGUAR POWERED CAR MAY BE ACCEPTED TO RACE. Now before you all send in entries for your daily driver the car and you will need to meet certain levels. The car will need to pass a full technical inspection and the driver will have to belong to a current racing organization or have impeccable driving credentials. So saying if you XJS has belts, correct tires and the other bits and pieces it could run. There will be at least one Jaguar only group at Schenley Park with it's own race on Sunday and many of you may be eligible to race in some other group (At BeaveRun you will run in 6 class events and 2 Jag only events) I know with the price of fuel this year we are all thinking of costs when we make up our race schedule. Secure parking for cars and rigs will be available at BeaveRun so you only need to tow once for two races. By entering on the Jag power form your check goes directly to the PVGPA (they are a full tax deductible organization - how much you claim of that fee is between you and the IRS) Add in one of the best parties around and held at the track, under roof, and it gets real hard to beat. But we will add a few more things to sweeten the weekend. At BeaveRun there is Slalom racing going on also so you can get even more out of your car or perhaps your street Jag. We will have a car corral for Jaguars. At Schenley there will be a JCNA concurs along with everything else. If you would choose to stay out for the week there are all sorts of things going on all week long. We will also have tee shirts and posters and a driver & crew reception on Friday night. Unveiling of the HK Special!

Bob Alexander has done it again! Back in 1998, he surprised the Jaguar world when he unveiled a MK 2 saloon car restored to be an exact copy of the gold-plated car introduced at the 1960 New York Auto Show. That sensational reproduction caused a stir at shows throughout the country, including our own Concours. How does he top that? By restoring one of the storied Jaguar Specials that took the British hillclimb competition world by storm back in the late fifties, early sixties!

The car is the "HK Special" – so named because it was designed by Herbert Kingsbury for Gordon Parker in 1958. Parker was a noted British competitor in hillclimbs and speed trials in the 40's, 50's and 60's. He had previously owned a number of Jaguar-powered specials to drive in various events well known in the UK, including Shelsley Walsh, Prescott Hill and others. At some point the car was sold a couple of times, ending up in France where it disappeared into storage and was nearly forgotten. France is where Bob Alexander found it and brought it to the US for restoration by a team of experts under the supervision of Don Moore at Custom Transportation in Wakefield, MA. And that is where several JANE members, including Carl Hanson, Dennis Eklof and Herb Strachman, participated in the festivities associated with the first public showing of this marvelous machine on April 22nd!

This car is really Special with a capital 'S'! It has a 3.5 liter Jaguar engine, with twin superchargers! Besides going fast, this car is beautiful! The beauty of the lines of this special 'Cat ' are evident in the photos below. The two- tone blue body – its original colors– is complemented with nicely chromed and polished machinery. The HK Special is a true show car that once was a fearsome race car. We shouldn't surprised if Alexander's HK Special is invited to all the major concours' in the US.

A full article on the restoration is being prepared for a future edition of JCNA's magazine, <u>The Jaguar Journal</u>, but we wanted to give JANE members a quick report. We are hoping to convince Bob to bring the car out to our Concours and to other British car events in the area.








Arrive early.....we need to sign in, "tech" inspect the cars, walk the course. "Flag drop" at 10 AM.....
