Rehash the Concours at the JANE Monthly Meeting

The JANE August Monthly Meeting, scheduled for Wednesday, the 22nd, starting at 7:00pm at Skip's Restaurant in Chelmsford, MA, will be one of our social types of gatherings (that is, not a full business meeting). It will provide us with an opportunity to go over the features of our

JANE Annual Concours, which will have transpired a week and a half earlier, and we can get some ideas for how we can make future events even better. We'll be presenting a compilation of photos from the Concours, and there may be some other visual goodies on tap too. And it's summer—bring

your Jag for some tire-kicking in the parking lot before and after!

Skip's is easy to find—it's located on Route 110 just south of Exit 34 off I-495 on the right. The address is 116 Chelmsford Street, Chelmsford, MA, and the number is 978-256-2631.

JANE monthly meetings allow

you to get together with likeminded Jaguar lovers in a low-key setting any time you choose to. Why not come out on the 22nd, participate in a short-form club meeting, hash over the Concours, and grab a bite with your Jaguar friends?

JANE'S Friday Night at the Drags

Friday, August 24th

Night at the Drags has been announced by our club dragmasters Mike Kaleel and Brenda Soussan. A lane has been reserved strictly for us at the New England Dragway in Epping, NH, on the

strictly for us at the New England Dragway in Epping, NH, on the evening of Friday, August 24th. For those who missed the JANE Drag Night in 2006, a ton of fun was had by all who participated, and by doing it in August we will avoid the cold that detracted from last year's October outing.

While this is a JANE-sponsored event, you need not be a member of the club to participate. All you need is an interest in the sport and a Jaguar. The Dragway gives us a dedicated lane for the exclusive use of our club, and we invite all Jaguar owners to come out to show us their lead feet and pride in their Cats. Our club's last drag event had cars ranging from antique Jags to late-model supercharged rides that all reached amazing speeds.

Last year, the Dragway also reserved a staging area for our club that was di-

rectly across from the drag lineup, and we're expecting the same again. We will be using a handicap starting system to equalize competition in certain categories. This system is designed to enable vehicles of varying

performance potentials to compete on an equal basis.

Here's how it works: Each car and driver is given two trial runs to assess their potential, as measured by their elapsed time over the quarter mile. Based on these trial runs, each driver specifies his base elapsed time (the Dial). For any two cars competing against each other, their respective Dials are compared, and the car with

the largest Dial (the slowest car) is given a handicap head start equal to the difference of the two Dials. By using this system, virtually any two vehicles can be paired in a competitive drag race.

Here's an example: If car A has a Dial of 16.00 seconds and the corresponding figure for car B is 14.50 seconds, car A will get a 1.5-second head start. If both vehicles cover the quarter mile in exactly their own Dial, the win goes to the driver with the best reaction time to the starting lights, because the elapsed time is measured from when each car crosses the starting line, not when the lights go green.

So why not pick a Dial that will give you a big head start? Simple:



If your elapsed time is below your Dial (called "breaking out"), you are disqualified. If you pick a high Dial for your car and get a head start, you would be forced to wait for the other driver anyway to avoid disqualification.

Gates open at 5 pm, with races starting at 6 pm. JANE will have a secured area at the track where we can gather and discuss (sometimes heatedly) who will



drag whom, and where we will be able to regroup after each run and grab a snack. Brenda and Mike will provide refreshments at the gathering area. After the races, everyone's invited to join in a casual meal at a nearby restaurant to be determined.

Here's a summary of some of the more important rules to follow:

- No slicks allowed—street tires required (DOT approved racing tires acceptable).
- No bald tires allowed.
- Open exhaust not allowed.
- Co-driver allowed in all vehicles running 14.00 seconds or slower.
- Seat belts are required.
- Overflow can for radiator.
- Battery hold-down bracket.
- Vehicles must be street-legal and able to pass state safety inspection.
- Nitrous oxide permitted and must be installed according to the provisions outlined in the current IHRA Rule Book.
- Factory (OEM) installed computers allowed, but no laptop computers are allowed while in competition.

- Valid state driver's license required. Learner's permits are not acceptable.
- Helmets (Snell 90 or newer) required for all vehicles running 13.99 or quicker.
- Drivers and co-drivers are required to wear long pants, a shirt, socks, and shoes.

In order for the races to start quickly after we arrive at the track, we will need your car's model and year before you arrive so the track can start setting up the handicap system. Please give this info and address any questions to Brenda or Mike and let them know of your intentions to race as early as possible. Directions

New England Dragway is located just off Route 101's Exit 8 in Epping. The address is 280 Exeter Road, Epping, NH, and the phone is 603-679-8001. Here are the general directions to the racetrack:

- From I-95: Take Exit 2 in New Hampshire. Follow Route 101 West to Exit 8. Turn right at the end of the ramp and you're there.
- From I-93: Take Exit 7 in New Hampshire. Follow Route 101 East to Exit 8. Turn left and it's straight ahead.
- From I-495: Take Exit 51-B to Route 125 North. Get on Route 101 East to Exit 8. Turn left and it's straight ahead.

nce again, there will be a British Car Corral at the 25th annual Vintage Festival at Lime Rock Race Track in northwestern Connecticut on Labor Day Weekend. The British Car Corral attracts dozens of British cars of all marques.

The Vintage Festival itself is a four-day celebration of antique and vintage sports cars that includes trial laps on Friday, qualifying races on Saturday, a worldclass concours on Sunday, and the vintage races of ten classes of cars on Monday. For the past five years, the Vintage Festival has been organized by Steve Earle and sponsored by BMW and Rolex.

There is no extra charge for participating in the Corral. Advance tickets are available for \$13.50 on 8/31, \$31.50 on 9/1, \$18.00 9/2, and \$31.50 on 9/3. These rates are discounted from the regular pricing, and to get them you must visit the Lime Rock website at www.limerock. com or call 800.RACE.LRP. If you go to the Lime Rock site, click on "Tickets", look on the left for the "Affiliate Ticket Sales" but-

ton, and then enter "250" for the Affiliate ID and "BC2007" for the Affiliate Password. These will get you the discounted pricing.



and JANE members made a good showing at the SNG Barratt open house. There were great cars, ter-





Several "die-hards" remained after the tour for more munchies, drinks, socializing, and tire-kicking. We hated to see the day end—it was truly an event to remember!



This is not rocket science, but, even in this day and age of high tech, there is still room for simple solutions.

Installing the independent rear suspension (IRS) on an E Type should be routine, BUT, fearing that I would join the ranks of those who have suffered from the syndrome known as "the rear end falling off the jack," I decided to do something about it before it fell it! As can off the jack.

The solution was a 12" x 17" piece of 3/4" plywood that approximates the size of the bottom plate on the IRS, two pieces of 11/2" x 11/2" angle stock approximately

holding the plywood and angle stock, and one bolt with a washer

underneath in the stub shaft to lock the jack pad in place and prevent it from turning or wobbling.

That was be seen in the photo with the IRS resting on the modified

jack, it was a one-man job to roll

it under the car and raise it into position.

It is next to impossible to get the nuts onto the rearmost bolts with all four mounts fitted to the IRS. The trick to

some of the workshop manuals, is to install the rear mounts on the car with the forward mounts on the IRS. This way, the bolts and nuts can be installed

and tightened on the rear mounts.

The IRS rear holes are slotted to

12" long, two 5/16" flat-head bolts, installation, which is detailed in and some ingenuity. I drilled and tapped three 5/16" holes in the steel jack pad (the piece that does the lifting on the jack). Two of these holes were on the head of the pad, and the other was in the center of the stub shaft that slides into the hole in the jack arm. I drilled 11/32" clearance holes in the pieces of angle stock and corresponding clearance holes in the plywood, which I countersunk for the bolts. I then assembled the components with the two bolts

accept the stud on the mount as the IRS is raised into place. Don't forget to dry-fit the IRS to determine the number and location of the shims-especially important if new mounts are being fitted. As was the case with me, recording the number and placement of the shims on disassembly did me no good, as the new mounts were wider between the flanges. Then, with the IRS out, fit the rear shims and tighten the bolts. The forward shims are then fitted after the IRS is in place before tightening these bolts. 🤏



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
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

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
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
