Tips on Cleaning and Concours Preparation By Aldo Cipriano

Whether you choose Championship, Driven, or Special Division, or Enthusiast's Display, a few cleaning tips after 35 years of detailing are heretofore graciously shared. For the sake of brevity I will do this in the quick point format.

• Glass: Easiest enhancement, but most overlooked. Many products

leave film or streak. Never apply in sun. The best approach is the California custom detailing: Buckets of warm water, clean white terry cloth towels, hand rub with moderate elbow grease. Except for this classic approach, the best product I have found is "Invisible Glass" by Stoner. No streaks, easy application.

- **Tires:** High-sheen products are to be avoided. Jaguar Concours is not "cal custom" or GM Motorama. Proper hand-brush cleaning with such simple products as "bleach white," even for black walls, is fine. As for product application on tires, spray-on foam vs. sponge application the jury is still out. Armor All tire foam is good for low shine and is quick. Sponge application may last longer, but can be a bit messy. Your intended achievement is a clear, uniformly black tire or white sidewall no grit, soil, or scuffs visible.
- Wheels: An exterior item that is scrutinized in Concours for authenticity, condition, and cleanliness, and if correctly prepared, makes your show Jaguar a standout. (a) Normal cleaning of coated alloy is a must, because standing brake dust is like cement to remove. Gently wash and clean with mild products, avoid etching products. What cannot be removed this way should be cleaned with a wax/ cleaner or body type scrub product. Meguiar's has some standout products in this area. Remember you are cleaning the clear coat, not the alloy wheel per se. (b) Older Jag Chrome "Dish" Wheels: Best chrome cleaner for me by far is "Mothers." I have tried them all, including Jaguar factory chrome cleaner, and so far this is superior. Always finish with a coat of carnauba paste wax, carefully polished by hand with terry cloth towels.
- **AVOID! AVOID!** Wax residue on wheel, wheel ornament, or crevices. This reflects laziness in prep; if it happens, old toothbrushes with moderate bristles are best.
- Dayton Type Contemporary Wires or Jaguar Classic Wires: Ah, nothing looks better on a Jag than pristine clean wires,

even so with British grey painted originals. On the other hand, nothing looks worse than wires with rust or deep deposits of brake dust.

- For normal cleaning, now recommended by Dayton and BBS (translates to not caustic, with no damage) is Eagle I Wirewheel cleaner. Follow directions: not on hot wheels; always rinse thoroughly; then get out the popsicle sticks, q-tips, and terry swabs; finish with Mothers Carnauba paste wax. Dayton also has its own product available through SNG Barrett. Bought it. Used it. Result was dazzling.
- **Body Wax:** Wax products for vehicle body can vary with paint type and condition (i.e., enamel, lacquer, clear coat/base coat, or traditional paint, which can oxidize, and with paint cleaner, a paint residue is removed. My general wax procedures are simple for traditional paint jobs: (a) paint cleaner or cleaner wax, (b) liquid polish, and (c) carnauba wax in paste form. Again, I like Meguiar's for paint cleaner and polish, "Mothers" paste wax for the finish.
- Sometimes, depending on paint condition, all three of these steps are needed. Do these steps over time, do not rush in one day it won't be fun, but the results will show.
- Newer products for clear coat that are worth a try are body clay with a detailing spray. This really does remove deep dirt and grime. Follow this with polish and wax as a substitute for paint cleaner. "Griot's Garage" body detailer is my favorite, but both Meguiar's and Mothers products are also exceptional.

A last cutting edge product I used recently on my Range Rover, with its deep multi-coat tintern green clear coat, is "ICE" by "Turtle Wax." I know it sounds like a gimmick. This is a synthetic polymer polish in liquid and paste form, but when used on good condition paint, it is outstanding. No white residue, easy to use, temporary hiding of scratches and minor chips (a few weeks), even good bead. Not a replacement for the above regimen, but a definite plus product for quick application before Concours. Use with new microfiber cleaning cloth (which is truly superior to the trusty terry cloth in application of all body wax and cleaner type products). Microfiber cloth is easy.





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

WMC BMW Skid School -- Take 2 **By Adrian Curtis**

1 at NHMS on June 6th. Last spring I drove my 2008, "JANE Members Learn to Drive," by Tracey his beautiful and fast XK8, while I brought my represented ourselves well.

The course is all about vehicle dynamics (weight transfer), EXCEED-ING the limits, anticipating the "breakaway," driving smoothly to recover, and learning to use oversteer to your advantage. The curriculum consists of threshold braking and lane change exercises, the skid pad (there were two), combining both for a Figure 8 exercise (note: they run two cars at once on this basically huge slalom course), and last, in "BMW speak," autocross.

Ray ran beautifully. His sticky rear tires were difficult to break away, but with the hand brake lever available, nothing's impossible for these BMW club instructors. My 120 threw the tail out easily, but the skid was difficult to catch with its large, 17-inch steering wheel and awkward seat- runs this often and they're online. Try it!

his was my second running of the BMW White ing position. There were times when I was able to counter steer, catch Mountain Chapter's Skid School, run on Lot the rear coming around, and hold a power slide for portions of the slide pad, but mostly I spun out and had to try again. Overall, my Mk VII has Mk VII on the skid pad (see Coventry Cat, May better balance, is more neutral, and easier to control. Surprising! None of the BMW instructors this year would drive my car. Woosies! The only Levasseur). This year Ray Duhaime attended with one who tried to drive it wouldn't fit . . . good guy, though.

Toward the middle of the afternoon the throw-out bearing on my car XK120 DHC. We were the only Jaguars there, but failed and the 120 was done for the day. With the Figure 8 exercise and Autocross to go, I was bummed, but my instructor said "Use my M3, it's parked over there, keys are in it," so I was all set. Blast! But after three runs through the autocross course, I was losing concentration and didn't want to screw up a nice, borrowed BMW, so I retired for the day and started timing the drivers. God's truth, Ray was the fastest, with a very quick 32-second best lap. While Ray was on the course, I strolled over to next in line, "Opn Wide," a 2008 Zo6 Corvette, and casually mentioned that the XK8 out there was just a little faster . . . that was fun!



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
