President's Update October 2009



Bylaws update . . . ready to nominate new officers for 2010 . . . more events in October

As many of you may know, JANE has not had official legal status as a 501(c) non-profit organization with the federal government. Without this 501(c) recognition, JANE could be taxed as a corporation. Needless to say, we as a club need to straighten this out. I have been working for the past year with Aldo Cipriano, Don Holden, and a CPA to amend our bylaws and to have the appropriate filings with the IRS.

At our September monthly meeting we had an affirmative vote by the JANE Board of Directors to amend our bylaws to read:

"In the event of termination, dissolution, or winding up of the Corporation in any manner or for any reason whatsoever, its remaining assets, if any, shall be distributed to (to the extent feasible) one or more organizations which, in the opinion of the Board of Directors will carry on activities which are analogous to those of the Corporation; provided, however, that any organization described in Section 501 (9c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code is not exempt as under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code."

The next steps (also approved by the Board of Directors) will be the filings with the IRS and annual updates to the IRS on an ongoing basis.

Chuck Centore has once again volunteered to lead a nominating committee for the election of new officers and board members to serve JANE for 2010. If you would like to become an officer or join the Board of Directors, please contact Chuck at cpc@anaconusa.com. Serving as an officer or director is a great way to enhance your JANE membership. New officers and directors will be voted in at our Annual General Meeting and Holiday Party on December 6th.

The deadline for submission of nominees is October 15th. Act NOW if you are interested in being nominated to represent our region with JCNA.

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





y 40-plus years in the automotive were opened for me because of the contacts that were made. Likewise with my many years spent within the automotive industry software business. Both of these positions afforded me many an opportunity to work
