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# President's Update February 2010

Organizing a rally is one of the more challenging efforts for a Chairperson, but here again, there are willing helpers in the club and a detailed "cookbook" available from JCNA. Please contact Carl Hanson if you have interest in leading or co-leading a rally this year, and we will find a suitable date in the autumn.

One JANE member who recently raised her hand to volunteer is Patt Centore. Patt will head a Sunshine Committee aimed at bringing a little sunshine to JANE members who are experiencing misfortunes, such as illness in their family. If you are aware at any time of any members who could use a little cheering up, please contact Patt.

Prior to our first driving event coming up in six weeks, we have two other events on the calendar. On February 14th, we will again go to the Gibbet Hill Grill for our annual Valentines Day Dinner. If you have not already signed up, unfortunately the event is sold out. We were limited to reservations for only 20 on such a busy day, and we are maxed out at that number unless someone unexpectedly is forced to cancel.

The next event is a tech session at Donovan's Motorcars in Lenox, MA, on Saturday, March 13th. Details of the topics have yet to be worked out, but a visit to Donovan's is always worth the trip. Carl Hanson has done the initial leg work on this event, but is still looking for someone to be the event coordinator. If you are planning on attending, consider volunteering to take over for Carl on this one.

The other event coming up in March is the JCNA Annual General Meeting in Indianapolis. Jim Sambold and Stacey Lancaster have been designated by the Board as JANE's official delegates to the AGM, and Prebble and I also plan to attend as observers. Any other JANE members are also welcome to attend as observers, but time is running out to register and book accommodations, so if you are interested, contact me pronto. It looks like a terrific two days of events, including a Friday night dinner and visit to what appears to be a very interesting private car collection at the old Stutz factory building that is now an up-market shopping area. There will also be the usual Saturday night Awards Banquet. The venue also looks interesting -- the old Union Train Station, now a Crowne Plaza Hotel, in downtown Indianapolis. Prebble and I are actually staying in a converted rail car! We plan on flying out of Boston very early Thursday morning so we can also take in the Indianapolis Speedway Museum in the afternoon.

In closing, I would like to take a moment to express our sorrow at the loss of long-time JANE member and dear friend to many JANE folks, Barbara Strachman. Barbara lost a 17-month battle with cancer on January 14th. Herb and Barbara have been very active in JANE, with Herb being a past President and a long-time Board Member. 
Herb has been the organizer/mediator, assuming many offices and roles in JANE's growth, including serving as JANE's President in 1994-1995, and has been a loyal member of the



### **JANE Monthly Meetings** Longfellow's Wayside Inn, Sudbury, MA





# **Position Opening for JANE Rallymaster**

### Did you notice that there is no TSD Rally in our Calendar of Events for 2010? JANE needs a Rallymaster!

What is a rally? First, it is NOT a race. A rally is a competition in which cars individually leave a starting point at a carefully recorded time and are instructed to accurately follow a designated route while maintaining specific various rates of speed along this route until they reach the finish -- where all the participants "rally"!

Rallying is a safe, enjoyable, but exacting motor sport that fully puts to the test your Jaguar's reliability and responsiveness, a driver's ability and a navigator's accuracy in interpreting specific route instructions. A driver/navigator team may run a rally competitively, or treat it as a pleasant day's scenic drive ending with the camaraderie of their fellow club members at the finish. Rallies can be a short distance or long, tough or fairly easy. They should be over scenic and uncrowded routes (we have a lot of those in New England) that can be negotiated within two to three hours, from 70 to 125 miles in length. They are not so complicated (at least they shouldn't be) that everyone, win or lose, cannot fail to have a fun day.

Would you like to get involved in a JANE activity of this sort, but are reluctant because you have no experience at running a rally? That's no excuse! Anyone who has ever planned/organized/run a rally was at some time inexperienced at it. This is not a problem. JCNA has a *Guide to JCNA Club Rallying and Program Rules* containing everything you could possibly need to know to conduct a rally: How to organize a rally -- General instructions for a TSD rally -- Instructions for running the rally -- Guidelines for Driver/Navigator -- Glossary of Terms -- and many more chapters of useful and necessary information. There is help to get started. And there is help within JANE in actually conducting the rallies.

# **Event Report**

## Previewing the New XJ at Woburn Jaguar By Dennis Eklof

### n Friday, January 8th, Woburn Motors held a preview reception for those interested in the new XJ sedan. At-

Tendance was limited by the light snow that was falling outside; nevertheless, several intrepid JANE members made the worthwhile effort. The car does not go on sale officially until April, but right now there are about 50 cars making the rounds of dealerships all over the world for preview -- I think there are 15 teams of 2 cars for the US. At Woburn there were two cars, a Burgundy long wheelbase (no more Van den Plas - Jaguar doesn't think it has much name recognition outside of old Jaguar buffs) and one standard sedan. Both are a huge departure from Jaguar's traditional look, and bear a strong family resemblence to the current XF. Everything has been done to make the cars look long, low, and sleek -- and they do! For most onlookers the reaction was "it's so big"! But, in fact, it is only one inch longer than the car it replaces and is exactly the same height.

Both long and short wheelbase versions are available with and without a supercharger, and supercharged cars get some other tweaks, including larger brakes. There is an array of wheels from which to choose, all 19" and 20", with only the 20" options available on supercharged cars due to the larger brakes.

The traveling roadshow really looks like a cool job. The two Jaguar USA employees on hand are responsible for driving these cars around to a string of dealerships in the Northeast and holding these receptions along the way -- they had been at Wellesley Jaguar earlier in the week.

Another interesting aspect of the evening was learning that these preview cars will never be sold. They are all pre-production models, and factories do not sell pre-production cars due to potential legal complications. They were built on the assembly line, but have been subjected to a lot of software and hardware tweaking to prepare them for the previews. Factories used to sell such cars, but in today's litigious society it's not worth the risk. The cars will be used by Jaguar employees for a while and then crushed -- all 50 of them. What a shame, and they have huge amounts of money in these hand-massaged cars. Have any really close friends high up in Jaguar -- or Tata?

his has appeared in the *Jaguar Enthusiast* magazine and in the Bristol Owners' Club Bulletin, so let's bring it home in the category "My First Jag."

US Route 66 tour brought back many wonderful memories of my trip the length of that fabled road, one of the last that could be made.

Spring of '57, my first year at college, I fulfilled the goal I'd formed when I first saw the MGTCs that the GIs were bringing back after the war. (The later 120s were out of my price range.) 
So – in late August '57 I drove out, over many days, sleeping mostly in the back seat whenever necessary, and thus finding that in the high dramatic Western scenery ... what larks!

desert, uncomfortable daytime heat turns to uncomfortable nighttime cold. I was awakened and had to keep driving to ward off uncontrollable shivering! Fortunately, and amazingly, I made the 2,400-plus miles without mishap: not even a belt or hose out in the desert. I made no profit - actually lost a bit - but it was all worth the adventure and the several months' enjoyment of an exquisite automobile.

Often on the journey I saw the beginnings of the US Interstate artin Gude's report in the January issue on the System (limited-access superhighways) that had just been approved, as the new highway paralleled Route 66 in close proximity in several places. Often, a new two-lane road was built alongside, traffic transferred to it while the original two lanes were widened and resurfaced, the thusly-created four-lane divided highway then replacing 66. 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### Searching for More Power By Gary Hagopian



While entered in an HSR race event at Sebring a couple years ago, Larry Ligas of Predator asked if it might be possible for me to convert a

Jaguar head from one spark plug per cylinder, to two. It seems that the leading Porsche racers either have two per cylinder from the factory, or are converting their existing engines, and experiencing a power gain of around 10 percent. And although a 10 percent increase doesn't equate to finding a "whale in the bathtub," it certainly is a significant




that a flat surface could be created against which the spark plug would tighten. That done, inserts were made to fit and welded in place, closing up the water jackets. After final machining and a pressure test, the new spark plug holes were added. The advantage of having done all the work from the top was that the combustion chamber and valve seats were not compromised (i.e., no leaks!).

Simple really. Oh really? Warpage could bind the cams from turning freely, rendering that head useless. Cracking

gain after having done all the standard stuff and having reached the limit of a normally aspirated engine.

After a little thought, I decided to try the conversion on an old head that was hanging around my garage. Plus, it was a project that might keep me "off the bar stools" a little longer! The difference between adding another hole in a Porsche's air-cooled head, and punching thru a Jaguar's water jacket and into the combustion chamber, whilst avoiding fouling the valve seats, was daunting. Add to that the potential for water leaks into the intake ports and combustion chambers, and you have a formula for disaster!

Having done a little research, I discovered that Jaguar had made several twin-plug heads in the late 50s for Briggs Cunningham. Norman Dewis said "maybe a couple of dozen," and that "wide-angle" heads were cast specifically for that purpose, i.e., not requiring passage thru the water jacket for the second plug. Take a look at the original all-aluminum alloy 3.0L Jaguar engine in accompanying pictures. This engine is in Stewart, FL, original to the "Tojiero Jaguar" owned by Henry Grady. Note that the second spark plug locations are plugged off and unused.



My "ace-in-the-hole" on this project was my friend, fellow JANE member, and master welder, Kaz Kielb, who had agreed to do the welding required. With that comforting knowledge, I proceeded to cut thru the water jacket in the three places shown. The spherical shape of the back of the combustion chambers required a buildup of weld there, so



would result in leaks. Proper preheating and welding techniques have allowed us to make six 12-plug heads without a failure, and overheating has been non-existent. An added development has been the availability of new, unused heads, released by the British military as surplus and becoming available thru SNG Barratt. These fresh heads make welding a pleasure.



From the pictures of the assembly on my E-Ttype, you can see that the final product looks factory made. Ignition is by a custom-made distributor from my shop, utilizing a Mallory module, Marelli XJS distributor cap, and an XJS rotor modified to fire two plugs simultaneously. Twin plugs require two separate ignition systems to fire the individual plugs. Mine now has two ignition switches, allowing either to be fired individually, or both simultaneously.

Firing two plugs in a hemispherical combustion chamber burns the mixture faster and more completely, making more power and requiring



less spark advance at peak power. Firing with the piston closer to TDC wastes less power, and may even allow the use of lower octane fuel. Engine dyno testing at Terry's Jaguar in Illinois last summer proved encouraging. However, with a complete installation now in my own car, we should get definitive results. Having engaged the second ignition on a level street at 3000 RPMs and neutral throttle produced the feeling of being pushed, while RPMs increased by 400.



All those wires look impressive, but final judgment of the concept will depend upon dynamometer results, expected in about a month. Anyone else interested?



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



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
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
