Bruce Whitmore's Jaguar Still on the Big Screen!

Tracey Levasseur wrote an article that appeared in the January 2010 issue of the *Coventry Cat* about Bruce Whitmore's 2003 Jaguar Vanden Plas appearing in the New Hampshire-based short film *The*

Pond. Then at our February 2010 monthly meeting, the film's writer and director, Dan Hannon, actually showed the film and told us more about the story and his making of the film.

The Pond world-premiered at the 2010 Palm Springs International ShortFest, and has since won the 2010 Directorial Discovery Grand Prize Award at the Rhode Island International Film Festival, recognizing outstanding achievement in a directorial debut, and the 2010 Best Dramatic Short Award at the New Hampshire Film Festival.

But wait ... there's more! Now comes word that this award-winning narrative short film is about to have its Hawaii premiere as an official selection of the Maui Film Festival taking place June 15-19 on the beautiful island of Maui, Hawaii.

The Pond is a moving and surprising story about a young woman who, distraught over the death of her husband, sets about scattering his ashes in a place they had both loved, and in doing so makes a discovery for which no one could ever be prepared. The richly cinematic film was Dan Hannon's directorial debut and was shot entirely in Hollis, New Hampshire. Bruce Whitmore's red 2003 Jaguar Vanden Plas was used and seen prominently in the film. It's a star!

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




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Event Reports

JANE Magical Mystery Tour

ANE's 2011 Magical Mystery Tour ran on May MMT, five teams have now competed in all three of the events (2007, and planning effort. Prebble and I scouted four potential destination inns in March of this year, but from the moment we drove up the tree-lined driveway of the Wilburton Inn in Manchester, VT, we knew this was the place for MMT 2011.



The Wilburton Inn's history began with a Vermont farmer who won a parcel of land named Strawberry Hill in a poker game and traded it to Albert Gilbert for nearby farmland in the early 1900's. Gilbert, a wealthy Chicago businessman, and his friend Robert Todd Lincoln, President Lincoln's son, created two neighboring Vermont country estates. Gilbert's mansion was designed by an architect who blended a European Tudor style with the new Modernism promoted by Frank Lloyd Wright. When Gilbert died in 1906, his banker, James Wilbur, purchased the estate and named it Wilburton Hall. It was purchased in 1987 by Dr. Albert Levis, a Greek psychiatrist, and his wife, Georgette Wasserstein. The Wilburton Inn is now one of the National Trust for Historic Preservation's Historic Hotels of America. It is a 20-acre estate up on the crest of a mountain overlooking the Battenkill Valley below and mountains in the distance all the way around, and it was the perfect setting for our "mystery" destination.



This was the third running of the MMT, and we had our largest turnout vet ... 20 cars this time, some running the route individually, others in two- or three-car teams. Eleven of those teams were newcomers to the

21st, culminating about a five-month research 2009, and 2011), and the remaining four teams have now participated two of the three times the event has been held.

> Despite relentless rain all week and forecasts of rain continuing throughout the weekend, May 21st arrived with blue skies and sunshine, so everyone was in high spirits. The 20 cars departed from Johnson's Restaurant in Groton. Some teams lingered over breakfast, studying their route sheets, but George and Janet Jones, pros from having participated in the two previous events, were the first ones out, at around 8:30 a.m., followed closely by the team of Mike and Patty Axford and Jim and Crin Coull. Ray and Diane Crook arrived in their Jaguar 420 with an odometer in kilometers, so Diane had to spend quite a bit of time converting the distances on their route sheets from miles to kilometers before they could get underway! Dave and Joan Belle, who brought along their dog, Ozzie, were the last to get on their way, at around 10:30 a.m.

After everyone got underway, Prebble and I blitzed to the Inn by a shorter, more direct route, and began setting up "MMT Central" in our Hospitality Suite at the Inn. Prebble was standing on the hill overlook-

ing the approach to the Inn by 3 p.m., expecting the first arrival by then. Although everyone left Massachusetts in perfect weather, a few thundershowers did pass over the Vermont area in the afternoon, possibly causing a few delays, but Sandy Cotterman and David Moulton, in David's C63 AMG Mercedes, were the first to complete the 150-mile route, arriving at a little past 4 o'clock. David and Sandy were meticulous in their planning before ever leaving the restaurant in Groton.

Other teams began trickling in shortly thereafter, and by 6 o'clock, when the cocktail reception was due to begin at the Inn's main building, most of the teams were still in Jane MMT Central taking advantage of the Hospitality Suite. For a while I began to doubt whether we would ever get everyone to move to the "official" cocktail party!

We finally did got the cocktail party underway at about 6:30 and postponed dinner until 8 o'clock, and it was a good thing we did. Ray and Diane Crook were the last to arrive, just before 8 o'clock. We are not sure where they went astray, but when they opened their bailout instructions they were still 100 miles away from the Inn!

We were rewarded with absolutely perfect weather for cocktails out on the Inn's terrace with a spectacular view, and the hors d'oeuvres prepared by Chef Didier were spectacular as well. At about 8 o'clock we moved inside to the Inn's Billiard Room for a four-course dinner consisting of roasted tomato soup, smoked salmon (smoked in-house by the Inn – one of their specialties), a wonderfully-prepared filet, and chocolate mousse. Yum!

Then it was time for the awards. This year we had decided to officially recognize the advantages of teaming up with other cars/drivers (four pairs of eyes, etc.) and had awards for both individual teams and multi-car teams. There were awards for correctly identifying the most photos and for answering the most route questions correctly. Of course, a prerequisite for the awards was turning in your still-sealed bailout instructions.






