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From the Editor




ave you ever heard of the JCNA "PTS Program"? It stands for Passport to Service and refers to a folder with maintenance schedules and other information that was once included with every Jaguar sold through the dealers. One important piece of paper that was contained in the folder was a card the new owner could mail in to JCNA to receive information about Jaguar clubs in their area and points of contact for membership. Although much of the program has changed, the term "PTS" stuck to the new membership referral process and now encompasses the old printed card process and the new online membership information request via the JCNA website.

JANE's own Ed Avis has recently taken over the administration of the national PTS program. In this role Ed fields electronic and snail mail inquiries from all over North America and then works to introduce prospective new members to a local Jaguar club. JCNA membership has been declining for the last few years, and with Ed's help they hope the renewed emphasis on new member recruitment will reverse that trend!

In his first month on the job Ed responded to over 40 requests from potential new members. Ed has also created a map showing the locations of all of the Jaguar Clubs in North America, and a link to that map will soon be posted on the JCNA website. The air is turning cooler, the leaves are falling, and that means it's time to think about renewing your JANE membership for 2013. Jaguar Clubs of North America, our parent organization, has suffered financially over the last few years, and to remain financially solvent they were forced to increase the portion of members' dues that will be withheld at the national level. JANE has no choice other than to pass on those increased dues to our members. Your Board of Directors has reluctantly approved a new fee structure to cover the JCNA increase and also to cover the costs of printing and mailing the *Coventry Cat* to those members who prefer to receive a mailed copy of the newsletter. The new dues structure is outlined below:

\$65	Full membership with online Coventry Cat
\$60	Full membership with online Coventry Cat (early renewal discount)
\$80	Full membership with mailed Coventry Cat
\$ 75	Full membership with mailed Coventry Cat (early renewal discount)
\$25	Associate membership with online Coventry Cat
\$45	Associate membership with mailed Coventry Cat

Considering what we receive for our dues, I believe this is well worth a few extra dollars each month. JCNA provides a nationwide framework for Jaguar owners, including their technical assistance hotline, a tool loan program, a library of technical articles, national competitions (Concours, slaloms), classified ads, the *Jaguar Journal* magazine, the High Performance Driver Education Program, etc. At the local level, JANE provides monthly social functions with interesting guest speakers, driving tours throughout New England, "Magical Mystery Tours" – PLUS great friendships and camaraderie!







7ow, what a great thing, and it was even free! On Friday, September 21st, Jim Coull, Mike Axford, and I tracked down to Foxborough to take advantage of the Jaguar Drive Alive event, and boy was it worth it.

I had received an invitation to the event some time ago, but decided not to go, because I really am not in the market for a new Jag. However, when Jim Coull's beautiful E-Type was invited to be featured at the event, there was no way I was going to miss it.

We arrived about mid-morning, got ourselves registered, and munched a bit on the excellent pastries and free coffee. Right there in the middle of the huge exhibition area of the tent was Jim's E-Type, flanked by an almost identical color new 2013 XKR, and it was getting a lot of attention.

The organizers had picked up Jim's car with a car hauler a few days before the event, and they returned it to him the same way on the Monday after the event. While we were there they had a staff member watching Jim's car constantly. It came back with lots of fingerprints, but was otherwise unmolested.

The first phase of the event was a terrific presentation on all of the new models and power trains that Jaguar is beginning to offer. The woman who delivered the talk was fantastic at her job and it was most enjoyable. It is obvious that Tata is putting a huge amount of money into this new endeavor. Then it was off to the driving events, and there were four of them.

First I wanted to try the autocross. They had a nice little autocross course set up on the parking lot, and we got to hustle around it driving one of the brand new XKRS models available. These cars are phenomenal, with way over 500 hp on tap and a terrific suspension system. All of us got a big kick out of making the timed autocross runs, but none of us was fastest of our group.

The second driving event was a 0-to-60-to-0 acceleration and braking exercise, also using the 500+ horsepower XKRS. I think the 0-to-60 times in that car are well under five seconds, and the brakes are amazing. I kept my foot in it and I think I hit 70 before it hit the braking area.

The third driving event was an opportunity to try out the new (for Jaguar) all-wheel-drive system. The event organizers had trucked in gravel, sand, and a snow-making machine to give drivers an opportunity to experience the security of their new all-wheel-drive systems. I did two laps of that course, one with all of the traction control devices turned off, and the other with them fully on. The difference was really phenomenal. I could actually see a Jag sedan as an all-winter vehicle in New England.

The fourth driving event was much more mundane. They had examples of most of the new models available for us to drive at our leisure around a very slow little course on the parking lot. This was called the "refinement" event, and the object of the game was to try all the buttons and switches and generally get a feel for what it was like living inside of the car.

After all this excitement we went back into the main tent area and stuffed ourselves with a terrific buffet lunch of heavy hors d'oeuvres, and walked away with a well-stuffed goodie bag of Jaguar swag.

Tom and Mary Finan also took in the event on Saturday and had an equally great "Jaguar Alive Driving Experience"! I cannot believe I almost passed this event by until Jim's car got selected. It was a fun afternoon.

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
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
