As we turn the pages of the calendar to 2014 I'd like to wish everyone a very Happy New Year! I hope it started out great for you and only gets better as the year progresses. I also hope you've resolved to enjoy and drive your Jaguar(s) more and to become more involved in JANE events this year.

JANE membership continues to grow, and we finished 2013 with 299 Regular members and 9 Associate members. Since each membership includes both a primary member and a co-member our ranks are actually close to 600 individuals! We fell a little short of our goal of recruiting 60 new members, but we did sign up 47. We also had 16 former members whose membership had lapsed for a year or

more rejoin JANE.

We're also off to a good start for the new year. As of January 1st our 2014 roster stands at 206 (200 Regular memberships and 6 Associate memberships), including those 2013 members who renewed for 2014 and new members who joined late in 2013 whose membership was automatically good through 2014. Thanks to everyone who has already renewed for 2014. Your early renewal saved you \$5 and also qualified you for the drawing to be held at our monthly meeting on January 22nd to win a refund of your basic membership (\$60) for 2014.

BUT if you haven't renewed yet and intend to do so, please renew by the end of January. That's when the official JANE roster is sent to JCNA, and the membership at that time is what will be recorded as the "official" number that will be presented at the AGM in April. We're usually neck-in-neck with the Los Angeles club as the largest club in North America, so every renewal and new members count!

Everyone should have received a mailing with a renewal flyer, and many of you chose to send your renewals in by mail. That's fine, but if you haven't already done so I'd encourage you to log into the JANE website (http://www.j-a-n-e.org) and verify or update your profile information. If you renewed via the JANE website and PayPal I assume you verified your profile information, so that's what I'll use for the JCNA roster. If you've bought or sold a Jaguar, want to upload a photo of yourself or your car, or make any other changes it's simple to log in and do so. If you don't remember your user name or password I'd be happy to help you with that. If you don't have a computer or prefer not to log in I can make changes for you if you'll send me the information.

A number of you have "opted out" of receiving JANE email. That's certainly your option, but I'd encourage you to consider reinstating email since event notices and a lot of other timely information is sent out by email. All that information eventually appears in the Coventry Cat but may arrive too late for you to plan your participation in some events. If you're NOT receiving JANE email and would like to do so please let me know and I'll get you "reconnected."

## Bar Harbor and Acadia National Park Tour May 15-18, 2014

Leapin' Lobsters – it's only four months until JANE heads to scenic Bar Harbor, Maine! Ayah, we're headed "Downeast" for a great weekend of fun, frolic, friendship (and maybe some foolishness)! If you haven't already reserved your room for this trip you should do so SOON! We've reserved a block of rooms at the Bar Harbor Inn for the nights of May 15-17 at a rate of \$169/night (the normal rate for that time of year is \$201/night). We currently have 15 rooms blocked at this rate and can possibly block additional rooms, but the rate may be slightly higher. Anyone definitely planning to attend should reserve their room NOW. **Cutoff date for the discounted rate is March 15, 2014.** For those not familiar with the area, the Bar Harbor Inn (http://www.barharborinn.com) is one of the premier properties in town and is located on the oceanfront right in the downtown area within easy walking distance of all the shops, restaurants, tour boats, pubs, and other attractions. See the note below if you'd like to extend your stay.

(Other less expensive lodging options are available off the waterfront or just out of town, but you would be separated from the group. Contact Ed Avis for more information if you'd like to pursue this option.)

There will also be a small assessment per participant for a rally plate, awards, and other tour-related expenses. The assessment is not expected to exceed \$25 per participant.

#### Tentative Schedule:

**Thursday, May 15th**: Drive to Bar Harbor. Everyone should plan to arrive in Bar Harbor in time for a late afternoon welcome reception. Jaguar Scarborough (Maine)/Goodwin Motor Group has graciously offered to sponsor the reception (cash bar not included, but available) and will also have some of the newest model Jaguars available for a close-up look. Dinner on your own.

**Friday, May 16th**: Scenic morning drive across Mt. **Sunday, May 18th**: Depart at your leisure.


#### Notes:

A Complimentary Continental Breakfast is served each morning in the Oceanfront Lodge Lobby from 7am-11am. There are several other breakfast options within a five-minute walk.

If you'd like more time in the area, the contracted rate at the Bar Harbor Inn for anyone arriving up to three days early is \$158/night, and for anyone staying up to three days after the event the rate is \$180/night. Hiking, sightseeing, antiquing, and other options abound in this area and along coastal Rt. 1.

#### The Fine Print:

Individual room deposits, equal to one night's room rate, are due within 10 days of making a reservation. Individual deposits are refundable, less a \$30 administrative fee, given notification 10 days prior to arrival date. Cancellations received with less than 10 days' notice are subject to a fee equal to one night's lodging. Cancellation insurance is available to all hotel guests at a cost of \$25 per room and must be purchased on the day the reservation is made. This insurance allows the guest to change or cancel their reservation up until noon on the scheduled day of arrival with no penalty to the deposit.



#### **Advantages of Dual Ignition**

Editor's note: Your Editor contacted Keith Carlson inquiring about whether he kept any records from his Mark IV that might identify it as Dean Edmonds'. However, all Keith has is a recollection that his car was originally Royal Blue with tan interior.

I came across a copy of the February 2010 *Coventry Cat*, whose front cover featured a photo of Keith Carlson's Mark IV, which appears to be just like mine as described in my March 1 letter to the *Coventry Cat* editor. I wonder if in fact it is mine, as I acquired it only a couple of years ago and the photo of Mr. Carlson's car is dated 1957. My car's chassis number is 637222, so that a comparison could be made, and I've included a recent photo to supplement its appearance in the picture I sent to the editor in March. It would be quite a coincidence, and Mr. Carlson should be informed if I now have his car.

But that isn't all I found in the 2010 issue. Gary Hagopian's article on having two spark plugs per cylinder is extremely interesting, as I've been concerned with such setups for some time. For instance, the so-called Vantage engine in my 1962 DB4 Aston Martin has dual ignition, and, by the way, it also has triple Weber carburetors like the engine in the picture at the end of Gary's article. I've even designed what I think of as the ideal head. It has hemispherical combustion chambers with two (not three or four) valves in each one. They're big valves so that they're tangent at the chamber top, leaving no room for a spark plug. So where do you put the plug? Off to the side, of course. Which side? Put one on each side and that question disappears. Moreover, the ignition points are then separated as much as possible, allowing the two flame fronts to sweep across the whole width of the piston top. Gary notes that he has installed two ignition switches, thus demonstrating



the effectiveness of dual ignition by observing the rpm drop when one system is turned off. This reminds me of aircraft piston engines, almost all of which have dual ignition. That's usually regarded as a safety feature, for indeed you can fly home with one system inoperative, and I therefore dislike airplanes that use a single ignition setup for both sets of plugs. But it's really much more important than that.

An airplane engine has to be a slow engine because it turns a propeller whose blades must slice cleanly through the air without producing any turbulence, as would happen if the airspeed around any part of a blade exceeded Mach 1, the speed of sound in air. Now consider a propeller whose diameter is, say, three feet. A simple calculation shows that its blade tips will exceed Mach 1 at 3500rpm, so that the driving engine must produce its power at a considerably lower speed. For example, the engines in my Baron are rated at 3200hp, but deliver this power with full take-off throttle at 2900rpm. Now an engine's power output is the product of the torque, or turning effort, delivered by its output shaft and that shaft's rpm. If the rpm is limited, this must be made up for by lots of torque, which comes from the crank being pushed on by each piston assembly. But this push comes from the pressure of the burning fuel on the piston top, so that a big push implies a big area for the top and hence a big piston diameter. This is why piston airplane engines have big cylinder bores and hence big displacements, often as much as 20 liters.

It should now be obvious why ignition should be initiated at two points as widely separated as possible. Thus dual ignition is really a requirement for such an engine and not just a safety factor, with which statement I drop my theorbo and hope you have read thus far. My compliments and thanks if you have.



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A Study in Scarlet...For those who may not have had the opportunity to view an older Jaguar saloon from the backseat, Dean Edmonds has here given a glimpse at the opulence. Under the Mark IV bonnet sits an engine that looks clean enough to fry an egg on (although I don't think Dean would appreciate yolk on that shiny valve cover). The Mark IV was produced right after WWII and differed only slightly from the pre-war Jaguars. After the war Sir William Lyons sold the Swallow Sidecar portion of his business and concentrated fully on auto manufacture. He even bought the tooling from Standard, the company manufacturing engines for Jaguars up to that point. So Mark IVs with 2.5 and 3.5 litre engines were all Jaguar from body to drivetrain. 


#### Jag's First Ever Superbowl Commercial



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
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
