
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President's Update



Last year we upgraded to a new location, more convenient to major roads and without the restrictions placed on us by the state, while lowering our event costs by almost 40 percent. We also got "state of the art" wireless timing gear to replace the failing equipment we had inherited.

Nevertheless, in the past, Slalomophobes have cited the "level of commitment" as a barrier to participation. Fear not, all that has changed – we have invented Slalom Lite! It is a cultural shift designed to offer access to a broad range of drivers. Much like canned beer and sliced bread, Slalom Lite is a bonafide game changer. The fun is scheduled for Saturday, June 28th, at 1650 Osgood St. in North Andover, Massachusetts. Dean Cusano, of Motorcars Inc., promises that he'll be coming with his magnificent XJS 5-speed coupe, which holds the national record for fastest time overall, as well as being a featured vehicle in JANE's AGM display. I also expect Victor Cromie, with his daughter and son-in-law driving both his 1930 Austin and his XK140 OTS. Don't miss this great club event. Start July 4th week off right.

Located at Osgood Landing, adjacent to 1650 Osgood Street (farthest North parking area), North Andover, MA.

From the North, South, or West: Take Route 495 to Exit 48 Ward Hill / Bradford - Route 125. At the second traffic light, go right onto Route 125 South. Continue on Route 125 South for 1.5 miles. 1600 Osgood Street will be on your right. Look for the OSGOOD LANDING 1600-1650 Osgood Street sign and enter there. If you pass it, find a safe place to turn around and come back-that is the only entrance with access to our facility.

From the East: Route 114 West take a right onto Route 125 toward North Andover follow route 125 North for approximately 4 miles. 1600 Osgood Street will be on your left. Look for the OSGOOD LANDING 1600-1650 Osgood Street sign and enter there. If you pass it, find a safe place to turn around and come back-that is the only entrance with access to our facility.

Event Reports

2014 Jaguar Clubs of North America Annual General Meeting

Well, after two years of planning, the JANE-hosted 2014 JCNA AGM is all over but the cleanup. The appeal of a weekend in Boston was evident in the attendance numbers – over 250 people participated in at least one part of the weekend's events. All three of the venues were terrific. The center for the event was the Hyatt Regency in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and we couldn't be more pleased with the venue and the cooperation and enthusiasm of the entire hotel staff. The food was great, and the car display in the ballroom was stunning (thanks to the efforts of our club Prez, Jim Sambold). The MIT Museum venue provided a unique social event for Friday evening, the Saturday banquet arrangement was stupendous – who can complain about lobster dinners amid nineteen beautiful Jaguars -- and closing out the weekend with a jazz brunch at the Larz Anderson Auto Museum was just the right finale for the weekend.

The Cars

One of the most spectacular parts of the weekend was the car display at the hotel. We secured use of the entire 7,000 sq. ft. main ballroom from Thursday through Sunday and convinced the hotel to let us stage a car display in the ballroom and the adjoining parking garage. We had over 40 Jaguars on display, starting with a 1937 SS100 and going through the 2015 F-Type Coupe due in dealer showrooms in a couple of months.

Walking into the ballroom where our banquet was to be held was really stunning. As you walked in the main doorway, on your left was a 1957 Lister Jaguar (Chuck Schwager), and on your right a spectacular Mark IV DHC (Daniel Graf). Going around the room from the Lister was D-Type number XKD-515 (Jim Taylor); C-Type number XKC-034 (Tom Jaycox); two vintage racing E-Types (Brian Donovan of Donovan Motorcars); the fastest JCNA slalom car for 2013, an XJS coupe owned and raced by Dean Cusano of Motorcars, Inc.; and a beautiful vintage racing XK120 prepared by KTR Racing and driven by owner Stu Forer.

Continuing on the other side of the stage area was a pastel green XK120 OTS (Tom Larsen), a black XK120 OTS (Ray Binder), a BRG XK120 DHC (John Brady), a blue XK120 FHC (Carl Hanson),

a silver Series I E-Type FHC (Jim Taylor), the spanking new 2015 F-Type RS Coupe (Jaguar Land Rover), a red outside-latch flat-floor E-Type OTS (Chuck Schwager), an opalescent dark green Series I E-Type OTS (Jim Coull), a dark blue Series III OTS (Ray O'Brien), a red XK150S OTS (Ken Loring), and finally a beautiful silver 3.4 liter SS100 (Jim Taylor). All of these cars were top-level concours quality, and the overall impact of walking into that ballroom was stunning. But that was not all.

Out in the adjacent garage was a display of 20 to 25 other fine Jaguars ranging from XJS through several new models (courtesy of Sudbury Jaguar).

One of the amazing aspects of the show was that almost all of the cars belong to JANE members. Thanks go to JANE President Jim Sambold for organizing this outstanding display of Jaguars. **Thursday Activities**

Much of Thursday was spent getting the car display in place for its Friday opening, but the first event of the weekend was an informal dinner on Thursday night at Bertucci's Restaurant in Kendall Square for the JCNA Board of Directors and other early arrivals.

Friday through 3PM was devoted to a meeting of the JCNA Board, but others enjoyed touring the many attractions in Boston with complimentary transportation all over the city provided under sponsorship by Jaguar Land Rover. The dedicated van ran all day Friday and Saturday and provided scheduled and on-demand transportation anywhere in the downtown Boston/ Cambridge area.

From 3PM to 5PM both Friday and Saturday were a series of tech sessions that were very well attended and included hourlong presentations on 1) building a 1/3 scale XK engine from scratch (Bruce Murray), 2) modifying Jaguars for handling and

performance (Brian Donovan of Donovan Motorcars), 3) Jaguar toolkit authenticity (John Brady, Tom Brady, Carl Hanson, and Jim Sambold), and 4) the Jaguar parts business (Tony Lee of SNG

Saturday

For many, Saturday was a business day, with about 75 delegates and observers meeting on JCNA business issues until the tech sessions started at 3PM. For

everyone else, it was another day to take advantage of the many attractions Boston has to offer. Many went on tours organized by JANE to Salem or to Lexing-

ton and Concord. Still others ventured to Fenway Park or Faneuil Hall or the USS Constitution, or took Duck Boat tours. Kudos to JANE's Jim Coull for organizing all these activities, and to Jaguar Land Rover for sponsoring the complimentary transportation.

Saturday night of the AGM weekend is always the annual JCNA Awards Banquet, where those receiving national awards are honored. This year's banquet was sponsored by SNG Barratt, and was a particularly memorable evening. First of all, the setting was really special. Tables for the 190+ guests were set in the center of the main ballroom at the Hyatt, right in the middle of the fantastic array of cars I described earlier. It was quite a sight.

In addition to the venue, the program for the evening was outstanding. It began with a welcome video that was prepared just for JANE and this event by Jay Leno. In the video, Jay talks about how when he was nine years old an XK120 roadster kindled his passion for cars and his life was never the same thereafter.

Then it was time for dinner. When JANE was first awarded the 2014 AGM, one of the first questions we received was whether our guests would get clam chowdah and lobsters at the banquet. At the time that seemed unlikely because of the costs. Well, thanks to the spectacular generosity of our event sponsors, the answer turned out to be yes. The banquet featured a New England Clambake, complete with chowder and whole steamed lobsters! What a treat – and we made sure most tables had at least one JANE member present to educate the uninitiated on how to eat their lobsters.

Following dinner we were treated to a dynamic and entertaining program. It started with a really beautiful video produced by the banquet sponsor, SNG Barratt. I am powerless to describe it adequately, but the photography and scenery were beautiful, particularly if you like E-Types, the music was wonderful, and not a single word was spoken. It was smashing.

We followed that with our guest speaker of the evening, Jeff Curry, Brand VP for Jaguar in North America. Jeff has only recently rejoined Jaguar Land Rover after stints at SAAB, Volvo, and Ferrari. Having grown up

around his grandfather's Ford dealership, Jeff is a real car guy with great enthusiasm for the Jaguar brand. In addition to his commentary on Jaguar's plans for the future he showed a couple of terrific videos related to their recent ad campaign on the "It's good to be bad" theme. We hope to post these videos on our AGM website.

Jeff's presentation and the current Jaguar ad campaign theme drew mixed reactions from our guests. For most, it was dynamic, exciting, and exhibited the kind of enthusiasm and imagination that has been missing from Jaguar in recent years. However, some lamented the loss of Jaguar's traditional staid, conservative, dignified image.

In many ways, the new Jaguar image is working. Since its purchase of Jaguar and Land Rover for \$3.3 billion in the middle of 2008, Tata has invested another \$2.5 billion in Jaguar Land Rover, and the results are showing with Jaguar Land Rover sales and earnings increasing.

Three things are clear from Jeff's presentation. First, Jaguar is targeting a more youthful and performance-oriented demographic

segment than its traditional market. Second, they are planning to go head-to-head with Mercedes, Audi, and BMW in their model offering. With the addition of the XE to the existing XF and XJ models in 2015, Jaguar will have direct competitors to the full sedan range of Audi (A4, A6, A8), Mercedes (C Class, E Class and S Class), and BMW (3 Series, 5 Series, and 7 Series). Finally, the F-Type is being positioned to challenge Porsche's dominance of the sports car market.

From Jeff's remarks, we moved on to the JCNA awards portion of the program, where many national awards were given for both competitive events winners and those receiving special awards for their service to JCNA.

Lastly, there was a presentation by Charlie Olson, who is my counterpart for the 2015 AGM to be held in Philadelphia. It's an exciting venue, with a Friday night event to be held in the spectacular Simeone Museum and ready access to the many attractions of Philadelphia. We certainly plan to be there.

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
