





# The Continuing Saga of Bernie Yurt's XK120

The Jaguar owned by Bernie Yurt, the founder of NEXKA, has taken on a new life. So who was Bernie Yurt, what is NEXKA, and what Jaguar are we talking about?

First, NEXKA. The New England XK Association was started in 1968 and over time became our club, Jaguar Association of New England. Technically, then, Bernie was the founder of JANE. His first efforts to form a Jaguar club here in New England were to place a small ad in the Herald Traveler (a Boston newspaper), seeking enthusiasts who would like to share their interests. The first meeting was September 15, 1968, at a steak house in Millis, Massachusetts, followed by a driving tour ending up as a picnic at West Hill Dam near Uxbridge. Photographs in our JANE archives show Bernie's XK120 OTS among the small contingent of seven cars. Bernie bought that car brand new from Foreign Motors on Commonwealth Avenue, Boston, and owned it until just before he passed away in 2008. His last message to me was, "… I just sold my beloved Jaguar. Boo hoo."

The car was sold to Cooper Classics in New York. From there it went to JD Classics in England. And here is where the story gets interesting. Mitch and Kim McCullough (Kim is VP Marketing for JLR North America) bought it to drive in Italy's famous Mille Miglia. It successfully completed that test and now faces another scrutinizing ... the McCulloughs have entered it in this year's Pebble Beach Concours "Preservation Class." How that turns out will be followed carefully by JANE members and will be reported in a future Coventry Cat. Stay tuned for the rest of the story!


